



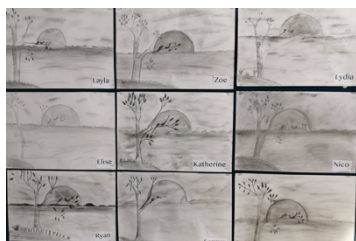

We have had a number of events to connect with each other during the last few days.

Thank you to the S'MART Community members who organised the Family BBQ on Friday night. It was lovely to see so many families brave the cooler afternoon to come together. We have had our first large group event with all of the Y5 - Y8 children participating in the Duathlon at Hansen Park on Monday. The children had the choice of competing / participating as an individual or team. Nice to see some of the teachers competing in the event as well. Although one of the hottest days for this event, we appreciated Jarad Pateman's organisation and movement of the children into the shade by the river while spectating. As always it is greatly appreciated by the teachers and children for your positive support to cheer on your child and their friends during these events.



Thank you to the parents / caregivers able to attend the 'Meet the Teacher' session we held at school this week. We had approximately 250 parents across the sessions. We have had positive feedback about these sessions so far. We hope you found them informative and an insight to the classroom. Some of the aspects we hoped to cover were; school hours, daily routines, school values and class expectations, home learning and vitally important communication between home and school.



This year each class will be sharing with families on a regular basis a 'window into everyday learning'. This could be images, a written update or video about something that has been happening in the classroom. We are trialling a number of approaches; blogs, dojo, seesaw. Some of these options come straight to your phone, so far there has been a great uptake of this new initiative by parents (please note classes will start using these at different times throughout the term). We hope that these shared experiences may be useful as a conversation started at home about the learning taking place at school. As a teaching staff we discussed the importance of reinforcing the school's values at the start of the year and to continually go back to these throughout the year. Each class has been acknowledging children that have been positively displaying these values in the classroom setting. Each week one of these children will be selected to have a hot chocolate with the Principal. I really enjoyed wandering down to Fava this morning with the Y5 - Y8 children (next week will be the NE - Y4 children).



In the playground we have introduced Playground Good Sort tokens to acknowledge children once again showing the school values during break times. Children place their token in their house coloured container with the house with the most tokens at the end of the term receiving a house prize. In case you want to chat about our school values at home they are; Respect, Caring, Responsibility, Personal Best and Learning. Next week we have our Y7 / 8 children participating in a three day camp at Waipara Adventure Centre. Sounds like a very exciting event. Thanks to the



teachers and parents supporting our children in this EOTC (education outside the classroom) experience. Looking forward to getting out for a couple of visits.



Next Friday we will have our first assembly for the year with one of our pods sharing their learning. We have decided to split the assemblies into two to allow more space for parents to attend to see their child's learning or celebrate the award their child will be receiving. The session we are inviting parents to begins at 2.45pm. We look forward to Rm's 9 and 10 starting us off this year. We hope you can join us if you have the time.

## Community Dental Service coming to St Martins School

One of our Community Dental Service preventative mobiles will be visiting your school soon.

- We will be aiming to see that all school age children enrolled with the Community Dental Service have their dental check-up in the dental mobile while it is there.
- **Year 8 students:** All Year 8 students enrolled with the Community Dental Service are transferred from the Community Dental Service to a FREE private dentist from Year 9 until their 18<sup>th</sup> birthday. To help with this transition please ensure you have informed your child of their family dentist (not orthodontist). This will enable us to transfer your child onto the correct dentist for Year 9 onwards. More information will be sent home after their Year 8 check-up.
- The dental therapist will not only be checking the children's teeth but will also Xray, clean and apply protective treatments (including fluoride) if required.
- If your child requires further dental care such as fillings they will bring home a 'Care Plan' which will explain what dental care and appointment times are required.
- When you receive the 'Care Plan' please contact our Call Centre as soon as possible as you will need to arrange a time to bring your child to one of our Community Clinics for this dental care.
- **Please let us know ASAP if you do not wish your child to have any of this care, you can talk to the staff in the mobile or phone/email our Call Centre.**
- If you wish to be present at your child's check up this will need to take place at our community clinic so please phone/email our Call Centre to make an appointment.
- Please contact our Call Centre if you want further information on the Community Dental Service, to enrol your child or if you have any specific questions about your child's dental care (a dental therapist will call you back)
