## WINTER ILLNESS UPDATE

We will also be available through the learning conference week if you want to pop in. Alice Denley has put together <u>information slides</u> for parents to refer to in their own time as well.


# **PB4L SCHOOL FOCUS - Responsibility**

# The Term 2 focus for Positive Behaviour for Learning (PB4L) is the school value of Responsibility.
