We moved seamlessly from Maths week to Book week. There was high excitement from all teams competing with the Board being the winners on the day with one of the Y7 teams placing second and a teacher team coming in third. Thank you to the Maths team of Alice D, Jarad, Chantal, Susie and Paige for organising maths options throughout the week. We now have a new draft Maths curriculum which we are starting to work through. The Government has also allocated each school one teacher only day to support the development of both the Maths and English curriculum for the start of the 2025 school year. Our **Teacher only day** will be held on **Monday 18th November** making the show weekend a day longer.

This week the school is a buzz with all things books. Thank you for supporting the character dress up day and the book swaps. We have also enjoyed having the opportunity to collect a book and having buddy classes reading together. This week we would like to give a special mention to our school Librarians who have been outstanding, helpful and organised particularly around the planning and running of book week this week. In a couple of weeks the Y5 / 6 team will head off to Hanmer for their 2024 camp experience. Thank you to Megan and



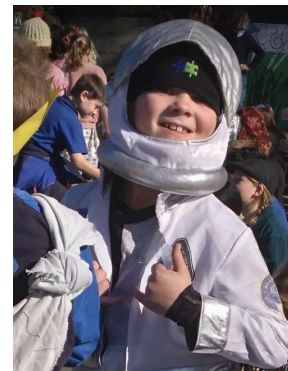

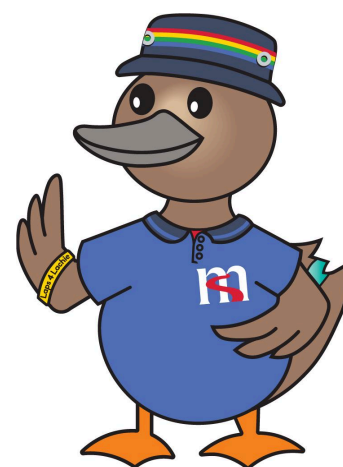

South Island Figure Skating Championships - Alice Nix

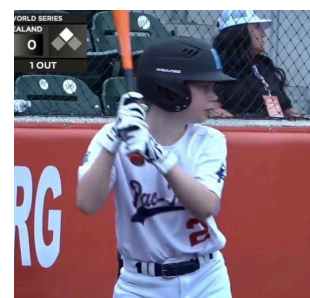
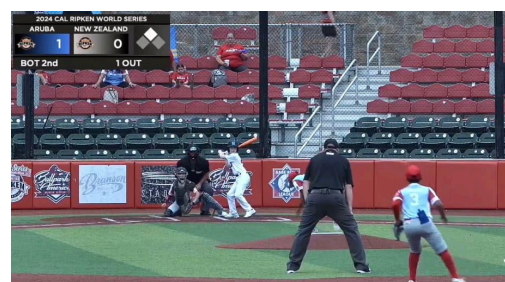
